




Come for an unforgettable adventure!

Every year the Puck Bay attracts more and more visitors from around the world, who come here to experience unforgettable Salmon trolling and other types of fishing. It varies depending on the season and locality – Salmon and sea trout fishing is performed almost all year round; more and more popular garfish can be caught here from mid-May to mid-June. Whatever the season, a nice catch and memorable time are guaranteed!

During one day trips, the organizers provide adventure and work to assure that your fishing is successful. Tours are organized by licensed English-speaking guides on well-equipped and modern vessels, departing from the major ports of the Puck Bay – Hel, Jastarnia, Ustka and Władysławowo. The customers of the "big fish" trip, accompanied by a professional chef, have an opportunity to prepare a meal with trophies they've caught. Nearby hotels with car parks and catering options are at the guests' disposal at any time.




KLAIPEDA, LITHUANIA

The best time for fishing is in the morning and during the evening hours. A typical fishing experience in Klaipėda is organized as a half-day trip, but we also offer full-day and longer trips – all to help you catch your dream game fish. Our experienced fishing guides, with a number of angling records from these waters, provide you with all the necessary equipment and guidance. We can also assist you in choosing the place to stay and recommend restaurants, where you can enjoy your catch.

LAHEMAA, ESTONIA

Hook your memories!

Lahemaa – the land of the bays – is surrounded with pristine nature, rich with bogs and forests, and bounded by breath-taking coastlines and largely uninhabited islands. Here, a mere hour away from Tallinn, you will find indigenous fishing villages and some of the best fishing spots on the Estonian sea coast.

You can fish from the shore as well as from shallow waters or a boat. We have long-standing fishing traditions and a great supply of sea trout; you can also catch pike, perch, and white fish. There are almost 150 springs originating in Lahemaa National Park, which is crossed by a number of rivers and streams. The largest of them – Loobu and Valgejõgi (both important for sea trout) – form waterfalls and cascades, the most magnificent of which are the Nõmmeveski waterfall and the Joaveski cascade. Our fishing guides offer an opportunity to discover places impossible to reach on your own, while enjoying a nice workout in the Estonian nature.



STOCKHOLM ARCHIPELAGO, SWEDEN

Exclusive fishing among thousands of islands

Waters of the archipelago have already provided for several sportfishing records. We offer exclusive sportfishing – everything from half-day trips to full-day packages with dinner and accommodation – with more than 10 BSF-certified guides and well-adapted modern boats. Explore peaceful bays, exposed sea and uninhabited neighboring islands, while our guides navigate you to top fishing sites among the nearly 30,000 islands, islets and skerries, each of its own character. Fishing varies depending on season and locality. Pike fishing is primarily performed in the inner and central parts of the archipelago. Perch occurs in large shoals during late summer/early autumn and has during recent years offered outstanding fishing sessions. Fishing for sea trout, our real silver treasure, performed during spring and autumn, is mostly done in the outer skerries, where encounters with seals and sea eagles are almost guaranteed. In early summer the trolling for salmon can be spectacular.
